

What is County Council?

A PTA County Council is a group of local PTAs organized under the authority of the Florida PTA. Local PTAs join the council as a unit, not as individual members, and pay dues according to council bylaws. The council president is a member of the Florida PTA Board of Directors. A County Council is the direct line of support and resource to the PTAs within its boundaries.

How to Become Involved with PTA

Call your school to obtain information regarding local unit officers, membership, and PTA meetings.

Talk to the local unit officers and offer to volunteer. There is always a need and everyone has something to offer.

Dues are usually a small amount and most schools will give you information about the benefits of your dues.

Your payment of local PTA dues also supports state and national projects. You can provide input into these projects through your representation.

Membership & Dues

Membership to County Council is composed of two voting members: the President and the Delegate from each local unit that is in good standing with all appropriate dues paid and whose bylaws are current. All PTA members are welcomed and encouraged to attend County Council meetings. The Duval County Council Board of Managers is composed of dedicated and knowledgeable PTA representatives from around the County. Officers are elected annually. Dues for County Council are \$35 per unit, per year.

Why PTA ?

PTA is the largest non-profit voluntary organization committed solely to children and youth.

PTA provides structure through bylaws custom designed by each local unit.

PTA has the guidance and support of various levels -- local, county, state and national.

PTA offers a wealth of resources and information to officers and committee chairs through material kits, handbooks, bulletins, program packets, videos, legislative dispatches, magazines, and leadership training.

PTA volunteers may serve as unpaid lobbyists on the state and national level. Delegates from local and county units vote at the FL PTA Convention on issues that are then presented to the legislators. PTA also has representation on important committees at the county, state and national levels.

PTA has a well-deserved reputation as a parent educator providing parenting materials on a variety of topics including: safety, drug and alcohol awareness, child abuse, TV violence, bullying, health, and self-esteem.

County Council's Involvement

Sponsors college scholarships and scholarship housing through Southern Scholarship Foundation.

Encourages blood drive participation through local units.
